MEDITATION ON THE LORD'S PRAYER:

1) Create a separate place in your home, your room, your life where you can let go and breathe, feeling that as you breathe, God does also. Sit or lie in a relaxed position and notice the rising and falling of the breath. Breathe in feeling the sound "nethqadash" and breathe out feeling the sound shmakh. Simply relax and breathe, feeling more and more letting go inside, creating space for the breath of God. Notice the beating of the heart and rhythm of the breath as it goes in and out. Let this feeling of breathing and heartbeat working together begin to create a place of silebnce and peace inside. Underneath this peace is an energized fullness---all action is possible. The silence is the shrine---the room. The fullness is the Name, God's light.

2) Anytime while engaged in work or action, take one long deep breath remembering this holy of holies within. The Name can become hallowed again, in an instant. Or: feel the sound of the phrase nethkadash shmakh inside. Let any small movements that this sound creates clear a space and bring you back to peace.

3) At another time, relax and feel the shrine created by the heartbeat and breathing. Notice which parts of the bvdoy feel enlivened by the meditation. Then notice those parts that feel separate or absent. Do not judge any as good or bad. Simply notice and accept them with unconditional love.
